Modular Supportive Housing at 175 Cummer Avenue Community Engagement Meeting #1

Join us for a Community Engagement Meeting to learn more about the new affordable housing building planned for 175 Cummer Avenue. The City is proposing a three-storey building with 64 studio apartments that will be ready for occupancy by the end of 2021.

Each apartment is self-contained with a private kitchen and bathroom. The building will also include a laundry facility, a kitchen and dining room, program space and administrative offices. The building is designed to support people who are exiting homelessness. A local non-profit housing provider will manage the building and provide support services to the tenants under an agreement with the City.

Background:

In April 2020, Toronto City Council approved the construction of modular housing as part of a 10-year action plan to reduce homelessness and relieve stress on the City's shelter system. The high-quality pre-fabricated housing is constructed off site and transported for assembly. Locations are being identified by City staff in phases, with 100 apartments already completed at 11 Macey Ave. and 321 Dovercourt Rd. as part of Phase I. The sites at 175 Cummer and Trenton Ave., in the east end of the city, are part of the second phase, with more to come later in other parts of the city. A staff report will be considered by the Planning and Housing Committee on March 2, 2021 to begin the planning approval process, including community engagement.



The Modular Housing Initiative is part of the City's HousingTO 2020-2030 Action Plan. Reducing homelessness by providing permanent supportive housing is a high Council priority.
